

Senior Lecturer in Practice Learning (Nursing) - School of Nursing and Midwifery - Grade I

Job Description

Purpose

To contribute to, and lead on quality assurance for practice learning for learners on nursing programmes within the School of Nursing and Midwifery. To undertake research and knowledge transfer through scholarly activities. To undertake specific responsibilities in relation to practice learning, as appropriate.

Duties

1. Engagement with relevant external organisations to enhance the learning and assessment of learners on NMC approved programmes in practice.
2. To contribute to the development of assessment of practice learning, processes, procedures, and policies within the school
3. Deliver simulation-based practice learning across all levels of the academic programmes in the school.
4. To engage in course developments relating to practice learning.
5. Make a major contribution to achieving the academic objectives of the subject group of Nursing and the School through scholarly activity, research outputs and knowledge transfer activities linked to practice learning and other appropriate areas.
6. Engage with the recruitment of learners onto courses and provide appropriate advice on progression and career opportunities.
7. Lead on quality assurance to ensure professional standards are maintained and learner experience is assured.
8. Attend local and national events on behalf of the University, to promote the University and its courses, and to enhance the profile of the school and University as a whole.
9. With regards to the nature of your role and its impact upon our learners, make an active contribution to and support the improvement of the learner experience
10. To undertake any duties relevant to the School's activities and commensurate with the level of the post, as directed by the Dean of School/designated Line Manager.
