

# Campus Lead for Students and Teaching - School of Medicine & Dentistry - Grade Clinical Senior Lecturer (at consultant rate if eligible)

Job Description

### **Purpose**

The postholder will work as a senior member of our medical education team supporting and helping to oversee the efficient and effective delivery of the MBBS teaching programme at Westlakes campus. The post holder's primary roles will be to offer leadership, supervision, and support to our academic staff and to local clinicians who contribute to the delivery of our programmes and to ensure that our students' feedback is effectively sought, heard and acted upon.

#### **Duties**

- 1. Line management of some campus day team members (shared with academic lead).
- 2. Oversee co-ordination of campus day staff teams and delivery of campus day teaching
- 3. Co-ordinate training activities at Westlakes for ad hoc tutors and local clinical staff contributing to UCLan School of Medicine & Dentistry programmes.
- 4. Provide/facilitate training for staff / supervisors as required.
- 5. Provide/arrange induction/training of new staff members where appropriate.
- 6. Provide input as required into student Professionalism, meetings.
- 7. Co-ordinate student-staff feedback meetings and facilitating the election of student course representatives.
- 8. Chair/Co-chair Westlakes academic staff meetings
- 9. Deputise for Academic Lead (Westlakes) as appropriate e.g., at University committees.
- 10. Contribute to administrative activities related to campus-based teaching including timetabling and localization of module guides
- 11. To contribute to curriculum development and innovation activities.
- 12. To participate where appropriate in student assessment, recruitment, and selection activities.
- 13. To attend any relevant meetings with the UCLan team.
- 14. To undertake any training relevant to the role.
- 15. To undertake any other duties commensurate with the role, as directed by the Director of Clinical Studies or the Dean of School.
