

Senior Lecturer in Optometry & Ophthalmic Dispensing – School of Medicine & Dentistry – Grade I

Job Description

Purpose

To contribute to the areas of course delivery and management in optometry and ophthalmic dispensing within the School of Medicine and Dentistry. To undertake, income generation, research and knowledge transfer through relevant activities. To undertake specific academic leader responsibilities in related programmes, as appropriate.

Duties

- 1. Lecturing at all levels of the Vision Sciences Academic programmes in the School, including Masters and CPD Programmes.
- 2. To take part in the development and implementation of plans for a range of initiatives and developments within the School, in optometry and optometric related programmes
- 3. Make a major contribution to achieving the academic objectives of vision sciences within the School through scholarly activity, research outputs and knowledge transfer activities.
- 4. As a Senior Lecturer, undertake significant administrative, course development and academic leadership responsibilities. Act as module tutor for a number of identified modules. Administer course registers, assessment records, learning programmes and other records.
- 5. To support the design of the communications, plan for the initiatives, engaging all relevant stakeholders in project development, ensuring they are kept informed of progress and next steps, and to communicate the project imperatives and objectives internally and externally using high level influencing, persuading, and negotiating skills.
- 6. Engage with the recruitment of students onto courses and provide appropriate advice on progression and career opportunities.
- 7. Develop and consolidate contacts with relevant external organisations.
- 8. To identify, manage and monitor risks for the initiatives, escalating issues when necessary.
- 9. Adhere to quality assurance and enhancement systems to ensure high standards are maintained and the student experience is enhanced.
- 10. Attend local and national events on behalf of the University, in order to promote the University and its courses, and to enhance the institutional, departmental and divisional profile.
- 11. Carry out other duties as outlined by the Dean of School/Line manager.
