

# Lecturer in Veterinary Structure and Function - School of Veterinary Medicine - Grade - Veterinary Lecturer

#### Job Description

#### Purpose

To organise, manage, undertake and examine teaching in applied veterinary anatomy and physiology to undergraduate students of Veterinary Medicine and Bioveterinary Sciences. To manage and co-ordinate integration of foundational science subjects (anatomy, physiology, histology etc) in an applied and relevant context.

In the development of this new area of academic delivery at the University, there will be scope and expectation to bring forward energy and innovation in teaching practice, as well as developing the post holder's academic strengths. For instance, the post holder will be expected to contribute to enhance eLearning and on-line teaching initiatives at both the UG and PG level.

## Duties

- 1. To make a contribution to achieving the academic objectives in the School through teaching, research, and income generating activities.
- 2. To act as a module leader for a number of identified modules relevant to experience and qualifications, potentially including animal contact and clinical assessment of patients
- 3. To undertake administrative duties relevant to module leadership (administer course registers, assessment records, learning programmes and other records).
- 4. To develop processes and procedures for ethical sourcing of animal materials and other technical supplies required for the teaching of veterinary and bio veterinary science students.
- 5. To support and develop the technical team in cadaveric preservation techniques and specimen preparation.
- 6. To engage with the recruitment of students onto courses and to provide appropriate advice on progression and career opportunities.
- 7. To adhere to quality assurance and enhancement systems to ensure high standards are maintained and the student experience is enhanced.
- 8. To contribute to the development of the School's commercial activities, including consultancy, training and funded projects.
- Educational research and development e.g., Development and evaluation of simulators and models for teaching purposes, as well as electronic material for student centred learning resources, and/or the opportunity to contribute to development and delivery of CPD, PPD or degree courses and programmes. To participate in research as an individual or part of a team.
- 10. To develop and consolidate contacts with industry/employers and other external organisations.
- 11. To undertake any duties relevant to the School's activities and commensurate with the level of the post, as directed by the Head of School/designated Division Leader.

- IT literate with knowledge of Microsoft PowerPoint and WebCT (or equivalent) (Application/Interview).
- Commitment to animal welfare in practice and understanding of veterinary ethics (Application/Interview).
