

Senior Research Fellow - School of Nursing and Midwifery - Grade I

Job Description

Purpose

The post-holder will, with support from existing colleagues and Director, lead the delivery of the Lancashire research Institute for Global Health and Wellbeing (LIFE). The post-holder will have responsibility for the day-to-day operational management of the Institute working alongside experienced colleagues.

The post-holder will also contribute to the research profile of the University by conducting world-leading research in Stroke Research Team. The post holder will be supported by experienced researchers, whilst further developing their own skills and experience in health research.

Duties

- To develop a programme of high-quality individual and collaborative research relating to the themes of digital health technologies and stroke rehabilitation research.
- 2. To conceive, write and submit research proposals with the aim of achieving grant capture.
- 3. To undertake research using appropriate methods with a view to producing a range of high quality outputs including publications in peer-reviewed journals.
- 4. To support the Professoriate and other colleagues in the School in the research and bidding process.
- 5. To promote the dissemination of research at University of Central Lancashire through conferences, courses, publications, professional bodies and associated research communities.
- 6. To contribute to the strategic development of research in the School with respect to University internal and external requirements.
- 7. To contribute to the supervision of researchers and research students aiming to achieve postgraduate and research degrees.
- 8. To contribute to the research informed teaching and assessment of students in the School.
- 9. To maintain and further develop the School's external national and international contacts relating to the relevant research areas.
- 10. With regards to the nature of your role and its impact upon our students, make an active contribution to and support the improvement of the student experience.
- 11. To carry out research administrative duties as required.
- 12. To perform any other activities in line with the requirements of the role as determined by the nominated reporting manager, Professor of Stroke and Older People's Care / Professor in Stroke Care and Improvement / Faculty Director of Research and Enterprise / Head of School / Executive Dean, commensurate with the grading of the post.
